gon, horses tied by halters behind wagons and young colts following with cattle placed between the wagons. I rode on wagon which was driven by my brother, Byron and Harlie rode in the surry behind the wagon. We would have to get out periodically at side roads and lanes to keep the cattle in the road between the wagons. The weather was sunny and the roads dry and dusty on that November day. We arrived at our destination at 11 a.m. and it took the rest of the day to get things in place. We had two stoves to put up, beds to assemble, as well as table and chairs and we were finally in our New Home.....".
