

MILITARY PENSION REQUESTS

Dec 9, 1908, Order for family physician to what extent the claimant is disabled or incapacitated for the performance of manual labor on account of gunshot wound of left shoulder and gunshot would affecting spine and right side near shoulder-independent of any other disability.

Dec 14, 1908, sent R H MCKNIGHT cert.

Jan 9, 1909, Order to be examined at Flora.

Jan 13, 1909, Examined by E.M. BOYLES, Geo W. STEELEY, E.C. PARK

Feb 4, 1909, Claim rejected-BOTHWELL paid me (\$2.00 fees due) -\$17.00 per month in excess is

not warranted by the degree of disability from pensioned cause.

Gun shot wound of left shoulder and gun shot wound affecting spine and right side near

shoulder. Affects of right hand covered in approval and rate.

CARDER, Anna, widow of James C. CARDER

Widow of James C. CARDER, Company G 21st Regiment Ills Vols, War of 1861.

Aged 62 years, widow of James C. CARDER who died March 7, 1908, disease for which pensioned under Cert No. 176555 and sequence-she was married under the name of Anne DEWEESE to James C. CARDER August 11, 1904 by Thompson Minister. Evidence of former marriage and divorce and death of each spouse on file in the pension.

Jun 29, 1909, Annie CARDER, no children, widow James C. CARDER, Com G 21-ILLIS

Jul 9, 1909, E. C. WEBSTER, M.D., Bible Grove, age 30: I attended James C. CARDER

from November 28, 1907 until his death March 5, 1908, during which time he suffered from

pulmonary-----complicated with lesions of the heart, the latter which was the immediate

cause of death results 1907, Nov 28, Dec 2, Dec 8, Dec 16, Dec 24, 1908, Feb 11, 17, 20,

24, 28, March 1-3, March 6 and May 1908, Jan 4, Jan 20, Feb 7, Feb 18, Feb 22, Feb 26.

Jul 13, 1909, call for Physician affidavit as to cause of death, etc. Par #4

Jul 15, sent letter back, evidence was filed.

Aug 5, 1909, Western Division, widow original No 922,943

Annie CARDER, widow James C. CARDER, Com G 21st Ills Inft, claim rejected on the

grounds that the soldier's death from disease of heart was not the result of injury of right leg for which he was pensioned, as it is not shown by recent medical or other evidence to be otherwise due to his military service. REJECTED
