CLARK, Sarah C, wife of Franklin D. CLARK

Act of March 3rd, 1899

1/2 pension-aged 40 years

He lives with his son at Marion, Illinois. Deserted her August 21st, 1909.

No provocation. She was married under the name of Sarah C. ARTERBURY, April 5, 1888, by a sheperd minister. This was her first marriage.

CLARK was married 2 times prior to.

Noel and Dora both dead prior to April 6, 1888.

William J. GALLOWAY, Noble, Illinois, age 25 years, enlisted at Columbus, Ohio, March 12, 1907. Discharged March 11, 1910 at Fort Duchesme, Utah.

He, in line of duty, March 7, 1910, while on preliminary practice, mounted pistol practice at Fort Duchesme, Utah, horse threwed him causing rupture of both testicles, which disabled him for
