Nov 11, 1908, Received certificate from National home, Danville,
Ills, as follows. I hereby certify that David N. HILLIBRAND, late of
Com I 8th Regiment, Kans. infantry, was found to be suffering from
the following disabilities at the date of admission to this home August 15, 1908.
Old injury to sternum, neutral insufficiency, bronchitis. Admitted to hospital
August 14, 1908 with mitral chronic bronchitis, old injury to sternum.
Died in hospital at 8:55PM, August 17, 1908.

Cause of death:

Mitral insufficiency. D. C. JAMES, surgeon

Oct 8, 1909, Lucinda BROWN, says that Lillie COURTRIGHT, his first wife, died in
1852 or 1853

Jan 16, 1909, Neighbor to Amanda HILLIBRAND and personally
knows that she does not own real estate, very little personal property,
her personal does not exceed in value \$90.00. She has no means
of support except her daily labor which does not exceed \$1.25 per week.
We know from personal acquaintance for several years.

Nov 2, 1908, Personally know that Amanda HILLIBRAND for 30 years
and ever since she was of marriageable age. Her maiden name was
Amanda FRYMAN. Her first and only marriage was to David N.
HILLIBRAND, April 27, 1890.
