Milton W. **Free** was born in the state of Ohio, October 14, 1837. He came with his father's family to Illinois in 1851 and located in Flora soon after the Civil War, about 1861. He was married to Susanna **Peake**, October 12, 1870. To this union were born three children, William Edwin, Charles E. and Hattie E. His son, William Edwin was killed in the St. Louis cyclone March 26, 1896. His wife died October 15, 1877, and he never remarried.

He moved in 1883 from Christian County, Ill., to Nye City, Oklahoma and engaged in the stock business. He was still living at this place when death called him December 27, 1915, at the age of 78 years, 2 months and 12 days.

He entered the Civil War and fought in many battle including the battle of Shiloh. The funeral was held at the residence of J. Y. **Durland** with interment in Elmwood Cem.
